Dorgan Visits ACC Campus

Sen. Bryon Dorgan, D-N.D., paid a visit on June 20 to the ACC Jamestown Campus to learn more about the Center's flood fight. Dorgan made the stop before attending a regional flood meeting at the Law Enforcement Center in Jamestown.

Sen. Dorgan, along with other lawmakers, is examining the lessons learned during the flooding in Jamestown and how to apply those lessons, in the future, to permanent flood protection. Anne Carlsen Center CEO Dan Howell says he will be working with Sen. Dorgan's staff to

help identify the needs at ACC, which will become part of a comprehensive plan for the entire James River Basin.

While Dorgan was on the ACC Campus, he spent some time visiting with students and staff, and learning about the Center's flood fight and 80-day evacuation.

"He was very impressed with the Center's response to the flood ... and absolutely amazed by the countless ways the community embraced us," says Howell.
