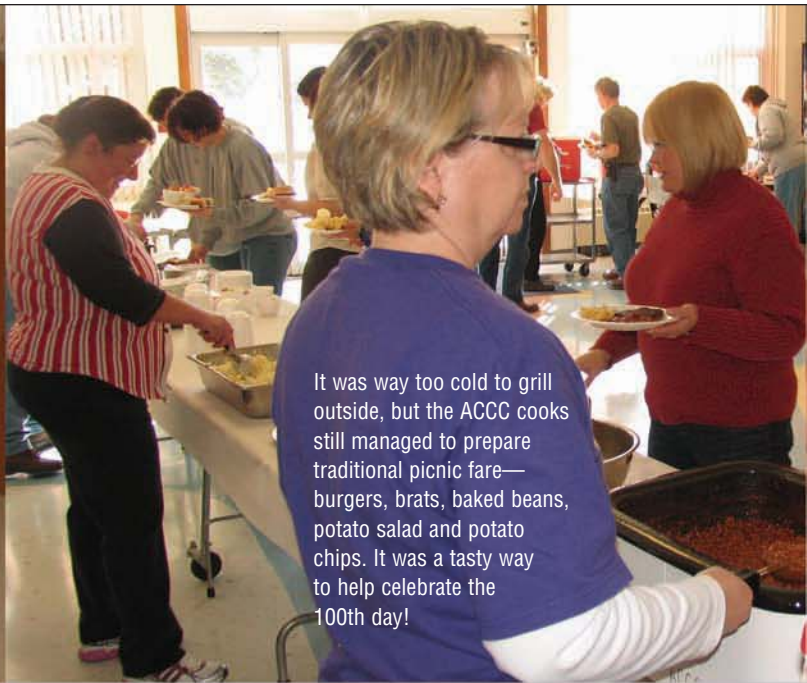
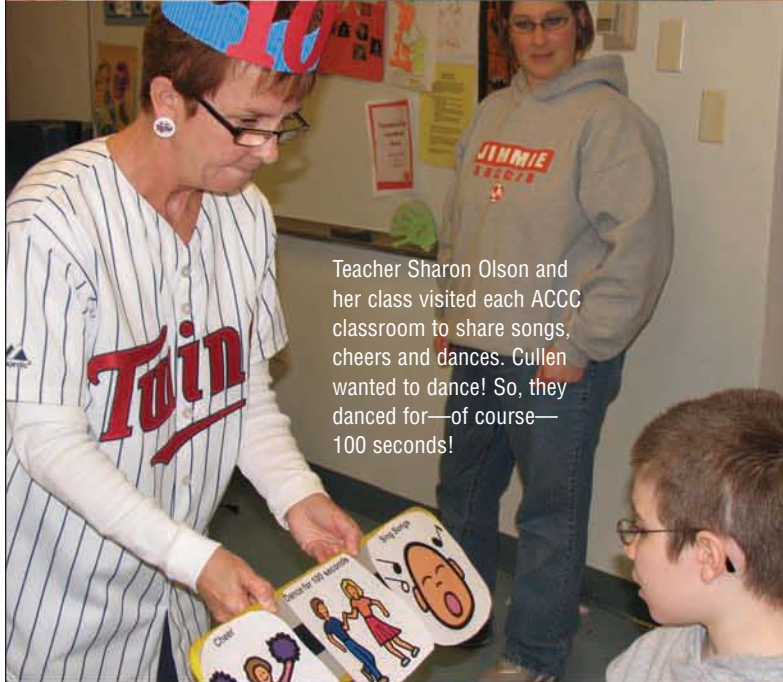




Jalynn helped create 100 snowflakes to help decorate her classroom and celebrate 100 days of school.

# 100TH DAY C

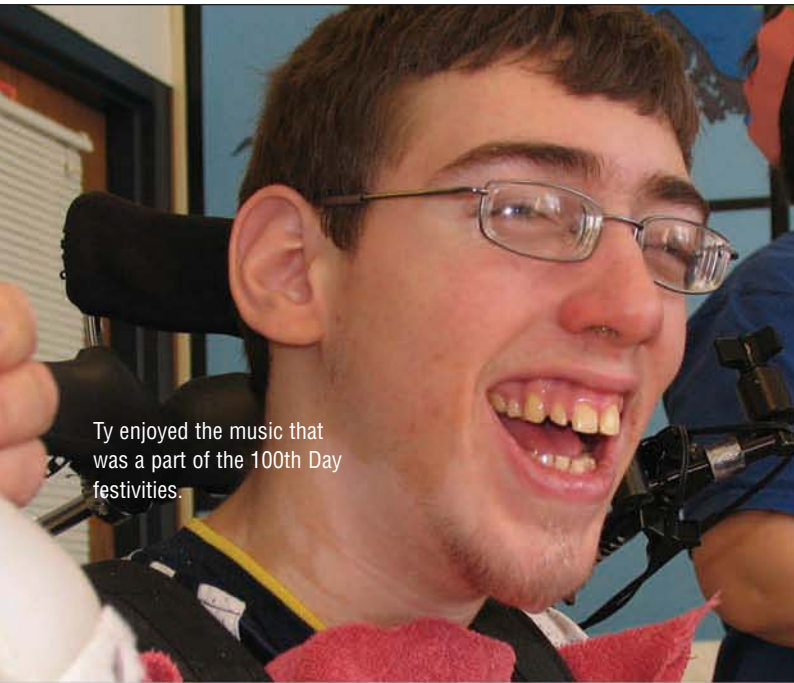
**S**tudents and staff marked a milestone on January 29. They celebrated completing the first 100 days of the school year!

The number **100** played a big role in the festivities. Each class took turns entertaining and educating the other students. Topics included:

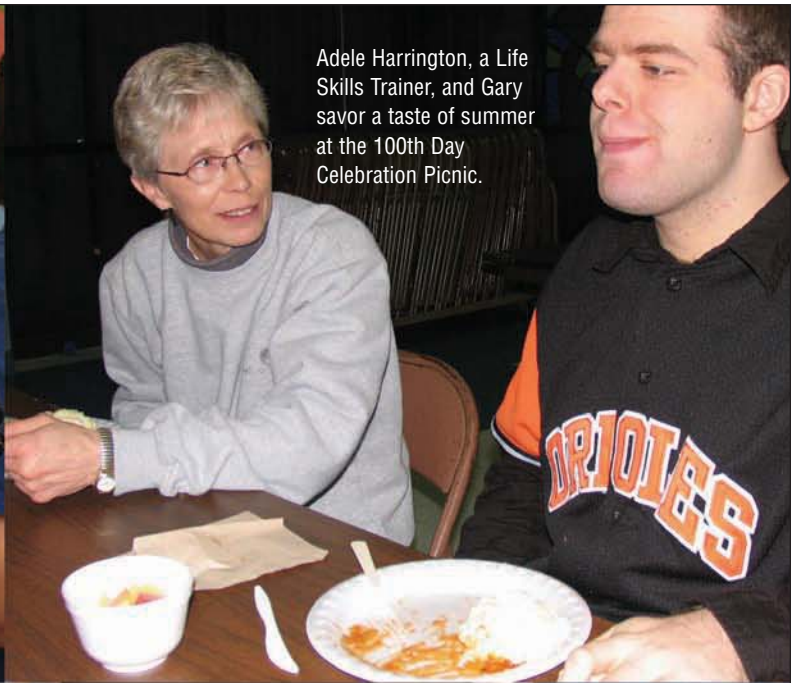
- 100 Reasons to Love North Dakota
