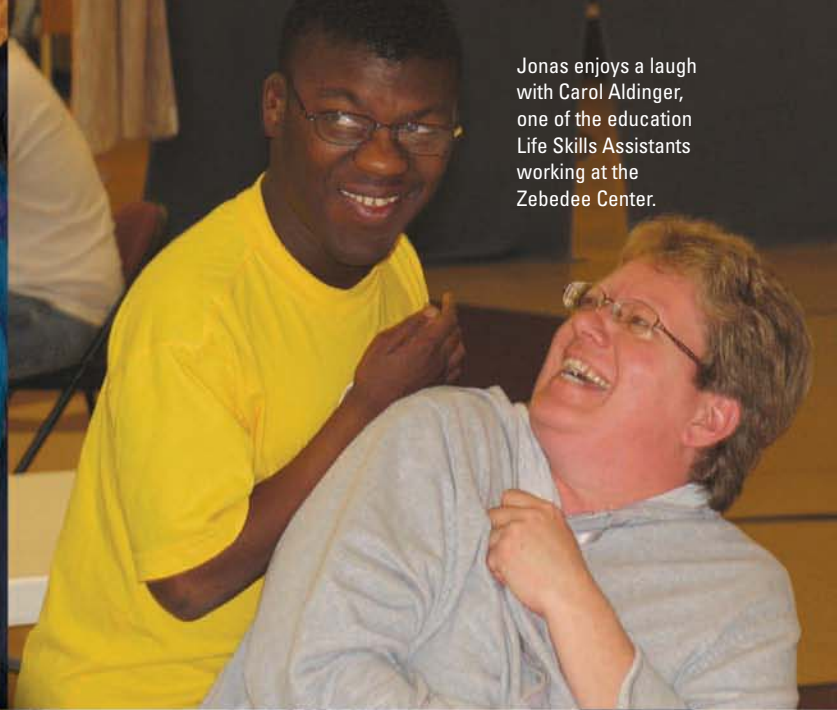
The addition of tents at some of ACC's relocation sites, in this case Jamestown Civic Center, helped create a fun, camp-like atmosphere for students.
