Soup's On!

Did you know that January is National Soup Month? Here is an easy Potato Soup recipe.

Ingredients:

4 potatoes
1 qt. milk (4 c.)
1/2 to 1 diced onion
4 tbsp. margarine
1 tsp. salt
1 tbsp. (heaping) flour
Dash of pepper

Directions:

1. Cut potatoes into small pieces and cook in salted water, with the onion.
2. In a heavy pan melt the margarine over low heat. Stir in flour and cook until bubbly.
3. Slowly add half of the milk. Add hot, cooked potatoes and onion mixture.
4. Use a potato masher to break up potatoes a bit. Add the rest of the milk and the salt and pepper. Cook over medium heat until hot. If it is not thick enough, shake 1 tablespoon of flour with 1/2 cup cold milk and add to the soup, stir frequently.
